**When handing in various samples please make sure they are labelled clearly and are handed in between Monday and Thursday if possible.**

How to collect a faecal sample:

- Use fresh droppings, if collected the evening before, please store in a fridge overnight
- When collecting, select 3-4 large pinches from the pile of fresh droppings. Try and collect areas that haven't been contaminated.
- Once collected, expel any extra air from the sample bag, seal shut and label.

We recommend testing horses individually for more accurate results, especially if you have any concerns, a new addition or a young horse. However, if horses are housed or turned out together we can do a pulled, bulk examination.
